

Science fiction novelist Kim Stanley Robinson to speak April 21



Don't miss your chance to hear from one of science fiction's most influential voices as Kim Stanley Robinson presents "Imagining the Green Transition" at Missouri S&T.

Robinson, author of more than 20 novels including the internationally bestselling "Mars" trilogy, *Red Moon, New York 2140*, and *The Ministry for the Future*, is known for works that explore ecological themes and moral progress.

"Stan is, without doubt, one of the superstars of science fiction. His 'Mars' trilogy has shaped how my generation imagined Mars and the possibility of human colonization," says Dr. Margret Grebowicz, event coordinator and Maxwell C. Weiner Distinguished Professor of Humanities at Missouri S&T.

Described by The New Yorker as "one of the best living science-fiction writers," Robinson has received numerous accolades including the Hugo, Nebula, and World Fantasy awards. His unique background includes participation in the U.S. National Science Foundation's Antarctic Artists and Writers' Program and speaking at the COP-26 climate conference in Glasgow at the invitation of the United Nations. His novels have been translated into 29 languages.
